

Checklist for proposers

Wireless@kth small projects are mainly targeted to be “seed projects” that have the potential to lead to the organization of larger Wireless@kth projects in cooperation with the industry partners of the center. Also projects exploring the feasibility of opening new research areas still not covered by the center are of interest. Proposals of scientific excellence and which show a level of innovation and match with the objectives of the research program, will be judged on the basis of the:

- Active participation of SME partners.
- Potential to spawn new Wireless@kth projects (including EU projects).

Proposers should in their applications specifically address the following questions, which also will be the main evaluation criteria of the program council:

1. What are the main objectives of the proposed project?
 - a. How do these match the objectives of the research program?
 - b. Are the resources planned adequately to achieve the objectives?
2. What is the potential to spawn a Wireless@kth project?
 - a. Are there any EU-programs that could be addressed at the conclusion of the project?
3. Industry partners
 - a. Are there any industry partners interested in the project results?
 - b. What is their intended level of involvement in the project?
4. Which scientists are involved in the project (short bio, track record)?
5. Which previous “Small projects” have the applicants been involved in?
 - a. Status of these projects (finished, on-going, etc).
 - b. A very brief description of the key results of these projects.
 - c. Have any of the previous projects led to new, larger projects together with the Wireless@kth partners?
